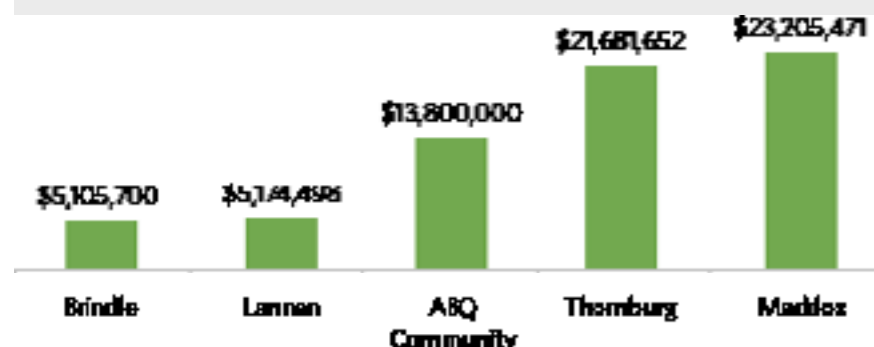

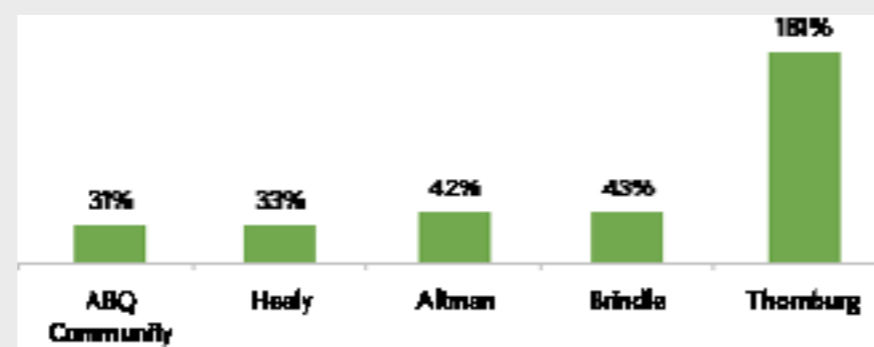
## How the foundations have shifted

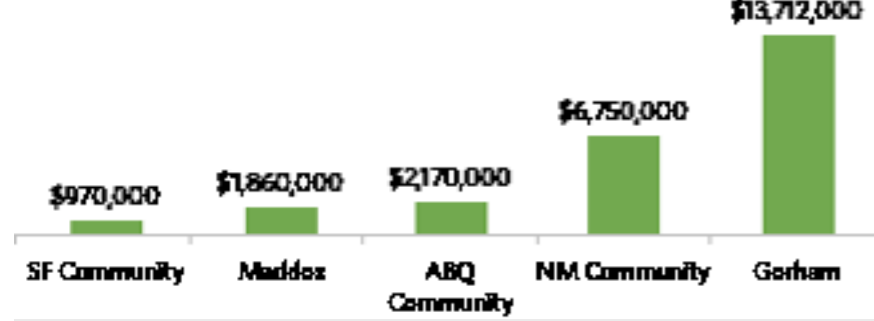
Dollar change in assets

A CLOSER LOOK

## Who are the 66 nonprofits new to the list?

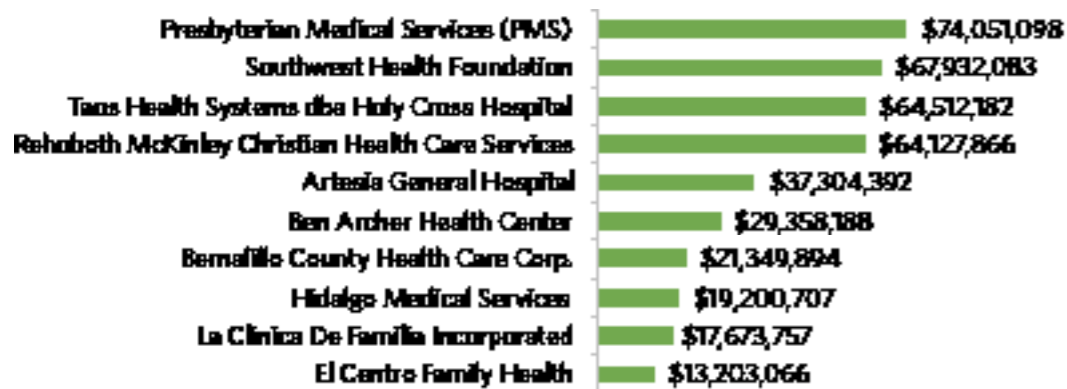
When we changed the criteria for the list to include any organization that had a nonprofit status, we discovered that New Mexico has more than 600 nonprofits. Of the 100 at the top, the largest new group was electricity co-ops. We wondered how this new group compared to the largest group in previous years, health care. Using the top 10 in each group (factoring out the three largest health care nonprofits on the list for comparison's sake) we learned keeping the lights on takes as much effort in nonprofit dollars as staying healthy.

Most nonprofits operate off revenue, with assets only as a backup. We wondered how much backup nonprofits had. The ratio of assets to revenue, expressed in dollars (e.g. NM Student Loans has \$31.45 in assets for every dollar in revenue) for the top and bottom 10 are in the charts below.

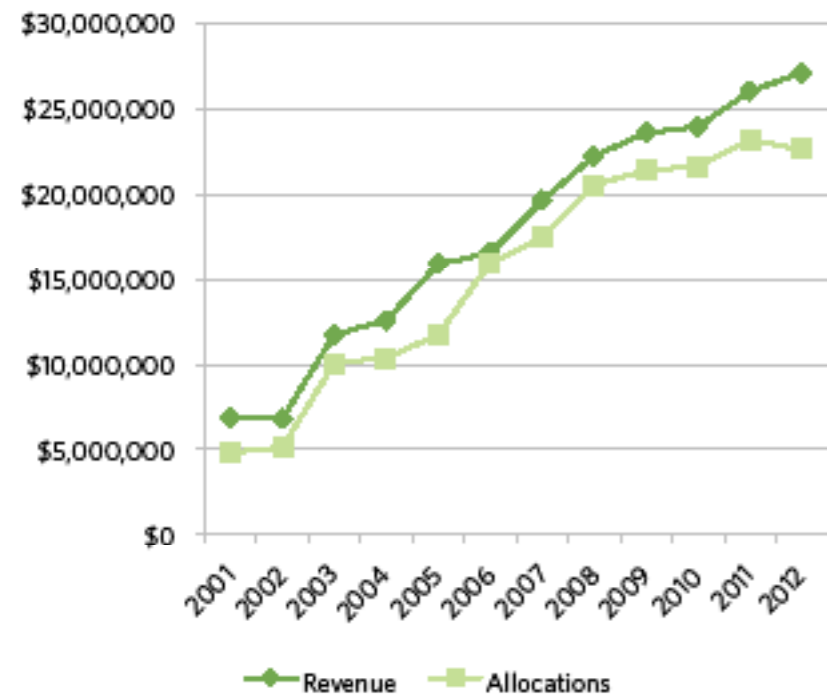

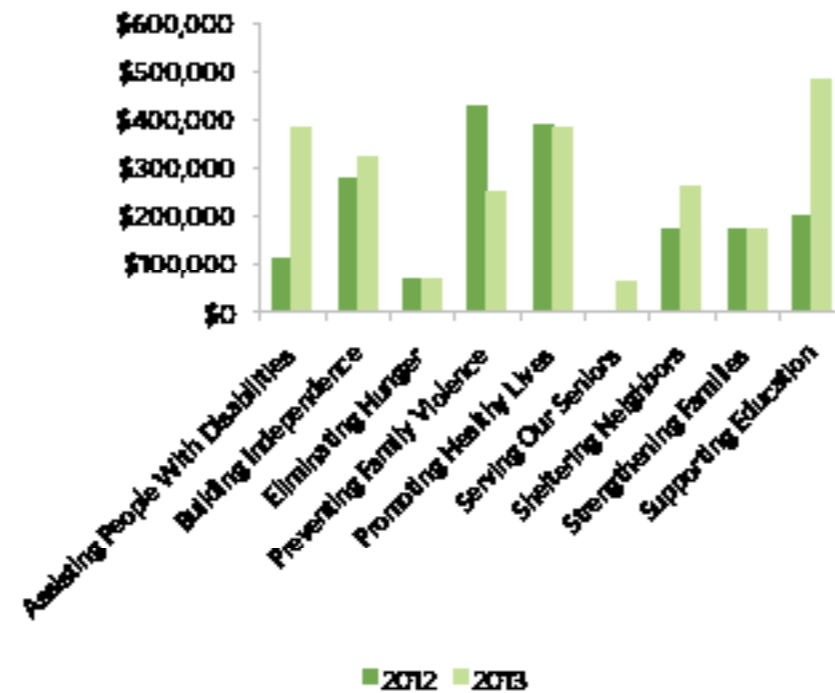
## How is United Way faring in these lean times?
